Signal path amplification is an essential technology in the field of wireless communication. Existing signal path amplifiers, such as MMIC path amplifiers, are mainly used in the field of power control. However, with the development of mobile communication technology, it is very important to amplify wireless signals in the baseband to control the power consumed by circuitry. At present, the majority of MMIC path amplifiers in mobile communication are single stage amplifiers which do not have pre-amplification functions. However, single stage amplifiers consume high power, are inconvenient to miniaturize, and are difficult to integrate with baseband circuits.

Territorial land reform in Chile The system of land reform was introduced by the first civilian government of Chile as part of the "chilean model" and was oriented primarily to the redistribution of land. Land reform was introduced in Chile in 1963. The system of land reform was part of the scope of the National Reorganization Process.

Background Following the Chilean Civil War of 1946, the economic policies of the legally elected Government of National Reconstruction supported a process of modernisation and industrialisation of the country in which productive structures were strengthened and income levels and living conditions of the middle classes were improved. The Chilean agrarian reform of 1956 aimed to instil in the rural economy a system of new, modern and productive productive processes. In the years following a period of relative stability in Chilean politics, the 1959 Chilean coup d'état struck a vicious blow to the development of the country. A period of military rule followed, during which a relentless and authoritarian crackdown of any political dissent was set up. The former Socialist president of Chile, Salvador Allende Gossens, was allowed to resign from his presidency in September 1970. He was arrested by the military dictator Augusto Pinochet a few weeks later. The military regime's dissolution was announced in the same year, paving the way for democratic order in Chile. Land reform at the time of the first civilian government of Chile was based on a combination of voluntary rural reforms associated with the programme of National Reconstruction from 1957 to 1959 and the institution of state-controlled agrarian reform processes. The agrarian reform of the 1961 Popular Unity government extended the scope of land reform, integrating the fiscal system in the agricultural sector and introducing the first rural credits to finance long
